

About Severe Asthma


Living with asthma and taking care of yourself start with understanding the type of asthma you have.

Knowing your asthma type is especially important if you are taking multiple treatments, but symptoms still interfere with your daily activities. If you have poorly controlled, severe asthma, it may be hard to manage, even with high-dose inhalers and oral steroids. If this is you, there may be a treatment option that can bring relief—so you can start getting back to things that matter.

Here are some signs that your asthma may be severe and poorly controlled:

- Even if you're taking multiple asthma medications, you still have symptoms.
- You sometimes have to take oral steroids for asthma attacks.
- Symptoms wake you up at night.
- You need to go for breathing treatment at your doctor's office.
- You've been to the emergency room or hospital due to asthma symptoms.
- Blood tests show that you have high levels of white blood cells called *eosinophils*.

Severe asthma with high eosinophil levels is called "eosinophilic asthma."




Eosinophils [ee-uh-SIN-uh-fils] are white blood cells that help fight infection and illness. We all have eosinophils as a normal part of our immune systems. However, high levels can lead to inflammation of the airways, asthma symptoms, and asthma attacks.

Do you have high eosinophils?

You doctor can measure your eosinophil levels with a simple blood test.

If your test results show a high level, your doctor may recommend additional treatment that can reduce eosinophils.



About CINQAIR



Here's what you need to know about CINQAIR:

- It is a prescription medicine for severe, uncontrolled eosinophilic asthma.
- When added to other medicines for asthma, it has been proven to prevent severe asthma attacks and help people breathe better.
- It may also help you to have fewer asthma symptoms and improve your quality of life.
- It offers personalized, weight-based dosing and is always administered by a healthcare provider



Weight-based dosing enables your doctor to personalize a dose to you. Personalized doses are calculated based on your weight at the time of your treatment.

CINQAIR can cause serious side effects, including:

Serious allergic reactions (anaphylaxis). Serious allergic reactions can happen right after you receive your CINQAIR infusion. These reactions can cause death. Allergic reactions sometimes do not happen right away. Your healthcare provider will watch you during and after you receive your CINQAIR infusion for any signs of a reaction.

CINQAIR works in a way that is different from inhalers or steroids.

Exposure to asthma triggers can activate eosinophils and cause them to multiply. This increase in eosinophils can lead to airway inflammation, asthma symptoms, and asthma attacks.

CINQAIR reduces the production and survival of eosinophils and reduces asthma symptoms.*

Results with CINQAIR



Proven results:

CINQAIR was studied in people with poorly controlled, severe asthma and a higher than normal level of eosinophils. When added to their other asthma treatments, CINQAIR provided relief **as early as 4 weeks**. Plus, improvements were seen through the end of the **1-year studies**.

What is CINQAIR?

CINQAIR is a prescription medicine used with other asthma medicines for the maintenance treatment of asthma in people aged 18 years of age and older whose asthma is not controlled with the current asthma medicines. When added to other medicines for asthma, CINQAIR helps prevent severe asthma attacks (exacerbations) and can improve your breathing.

Medicines such as CINQAIR reduce blood eosinophils. Eosinophils are a type of white blood cell that may contribute to your asthma.

- CINQAIR is not used to treat other problems caused by eosinophils.
- CINQAIR is not used to treat sudden breathing problems.

It is not known if CINQAIR is safe and effective in children less than 18 years of age.

Fewer asthma attacks

In studies:

CINQAIR consistently helped prevent exacerbations during one-year studies.

The majority of people who added CINQAIR to other asthma medicines did not have an asthma attack, compared with people who did not add CINOAIR.

- As many as **3 in 4** people who added CINQAIR did not have an asthma attack for the entire year.
- In comparison, only **about half** of people who did not add CINQAIR were free of asthma attacks.

CINQAIR also reduced asthma attacks that*:

- Required the use of oral steroids.
- Resulted in visits to the hospital or emergency room.

Results with CINQAIR





Better breathing

Better lung function means better breathing. Studies showed that people who added CINQAIR to their asthma medications had improved lung function test results when compared with people who did not add CINQAIR to their asthma therapy.

If you aren't sure how well your lungs are working, talk to your doctor about getting a lung function test.

Improved symptom control and quality of life

People who added CINQAIR to their asthma medications reported an **overall better quality of life** compared with those who did not add CINQAIR. And people who added CINQAIR had better control over their symptoms* than people who did not add CINQAIR.

*As measured by the Asthma Quality of Life Questionnaire and the Asthma Control Questionnaire-7. These tools assess the physical and emotional impact of asthma and how well asthma is controlled.

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Is CINQAIR right for you?



If you're wondering whether your current treatments are doing enough to control your asthma, the following may help.

Your asthma may not be under control if:

You have had asthma symptoms during the day, two or more days a week. Symptoms may include wheezing, chest tightness, shortness of breath, or cough.

You have used a rescue inhaler more than twice in one week.

Your asthma symptoms interfere with daily activities.

You have had to take oral steroids for one or more asthma attacks over the last 12 months.

You have needed urgent medical care because of your asthma.

Your peak flow rates are lower than they have been in the past.

Your lung function (breathing) test results are below normal.

You have taken a blood test that shows high levels of eosinophils in your blood.

Before receiving CINQAIR, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- are taking oral or inhaled corticosteroid medicines.
 Do not stop taking your corticosteroid unless your healthcare provider tells you to stop. This may cause other symptoms that were controlled by the corticosteroid medicine to come back.
- have or have had cancer (malignancy).
- have a parasitic (helminth) infection.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if CINQAIR will harm your unborn baby. Tell your healthcare provider if you become pregnant during your treatment with CINQAIR.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known
 if CINQAIR passes into your breast milk. You and your
 healthcare provider should decide if you will receive
 CINQAIR and breastfeed. Talk to your healthcare
 provider about the best way to feed your baby if you
 receive CINOAIR.

What to Expect When Starting Treatment



CINQAIR is given once every 4 weeks.

It is an intravenous (IV) infusion given by a healthcare provider. A small needle is placed into a vein in your hand or arm, allowing the medicine to go directly into your body. It takes as little as 20 to 50 minutes to receive the full dose of CINOAIR.



CINQAIR is given by a healthcare provider using a 50-mL bag—the smallest IV bag available.

CINQAIR is an "add-on" medication.

This means it is taken along with the medications you are already taking, such as inhalers and oral steroids. If you and your doctor decide that CINQAIR is right for you, keep taking your other asthma medications unless your doctor tells you not to.

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CINQAIR is always given by a healthcare provider at your choice of location.

Whether you receive CINQAIR at your **doctor's office**, **at home**, or **at an infusion center**, your healthcare provider will prepare your dose before each treatment. Your dose is personalized based on your weight at the time of treatment.

Wherever you receive CINQAIR, a healthcare provider will monitor you.

Financial Assistance for CINQAIR



The CINQAIR Cost Support Program.

If you have commercial health insurance coverage for CINQAIR, you may pay as little as \$0 out-of-pocket for the cost of CINQAIR and its administration (up to \$10,000 per year).*

*The CINQAIR Cost Support Program helps commercially insured individuals in the United States (including the United States territories) who are prescribed CINQAIR pay for their eligible out-of-pocket costs for the drug and for administration of the drug, including co-pays, co-insurance, and deductibles.

Persons residing in a state that does NOT allow financial assistance for the administration of the drug may ONLY be eligible to receive out-of-pocket cost support for the drug. The Program does not cover the costs of physician office visits or evaluations, blood work or other testing, or transportation. Eligible individuals must have commercial insurance for CINQAIR. Uninsured and cash-paying patients are NOT eligible for this Program, nor are individuals with commercial insurance coverage that does not provide coverage for CINQAIR.
